

Bibliography for Environmental Science Topic

Objective: Students will demonstrate an ability to utilize recommended methods of information access such as electronic databases to acquire published library in internet sources in the environmental sciences.

Report Format:

1. Headings – Begin your word-processed document with the same two lines as you see above and include a place for your name and date. Then, double-space down and center a title describing an environmental science topic of your choice (e.g. Ecological Impact of Confined Animal Feeding Operations (CAFO's), or Ecology of Fire-Adapted Plants).
2. Summary - Double-space down and present an approximately 200-250-word, double-spaced summary (a) describing the nature and significance of the topic you have researched, (b) why the topic is of interest to you, and (c) how your vocational plans might allow you to relate further to this topic.
3. Bibliography – Double-space down, and indicate “Bibliography.” Double-space again and begin your list of ten (10) references in alphabetical order, single-spaced but double space between references. Do not number the ten references. Use APA formatting (see <http://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/resource/560/01/>)

Types of References:

1. At least five (5) of the references must be from periodic scientific journals and be classified as primary literature sources (i.e. contain detailed “Methods” and first-time published data).
2. At least one (1) should be a secondary source (e.g. review article) with substantive content and its own bibliography. (e.g. *Annual Review of Ecology and Systematics*)
3. The rest of your ten (10) sources may be technical or may include a more layman-oriented article such as from periodicals like *Natural History*, *Scientific American*, etc. as long as they provide pertinent and substantive information toward your topic.
